PAPA MAIRIE PLANTING DAY

Kauri and Totara classes are invited to take part in a community planting initiative managed by Rayonier Matariki Forests, Thursday 8 August at 10.15am approx. A section of land behind the mountain bike tracks near Otuwheti Rd is being retired which lies adjacent to the Papa Mairie Wetland. The land planted in natives will create a riparian margin. Rayonier Matariki Forests will provide a bus free of charge for the students to transport to and from school to the planting area. The bus carries 45 passengers. This means there will be space for eight accompanying adults and two teachers. Employees from the Rayonier Matariki Auckland office will also assist with the planting on the day.
